

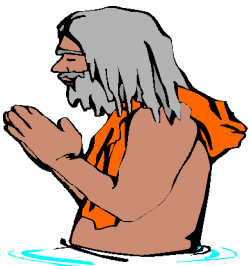

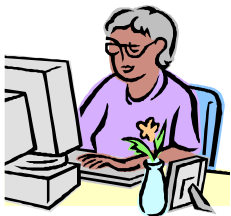
OLD FAITHFUL

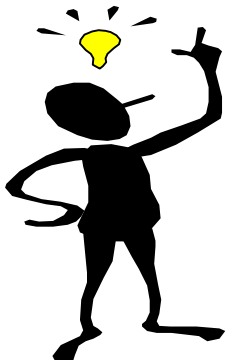

CHOCOLATE POUND CAKE

1 cup butter, softened; ½ cup shortening;
3 cups sugar; 5 eggs, beaten; 3 cups cake flour;
½ teaspoon baking powder; ½ teaspoon salt;
5 tablespoons cocoa; 1 cup milk;
1 tablespoon vanilla.

Cream butter, shortening, and sugar until fluffy. Add eggs and mix well. Sift dry ingredients and add to butter mixture alternately with milk and vanilla.

Grease and flour a 10 inch tube pan. Pour in batter and bake at 300 degrees for 1½ to 2 hours.

PRUNE CAKE

4 eggs, beaten; 2 cups sugar; 1 cup buttermilk;
1 cup oil; 1 teaspoon soda; 1 teaspoon cinnamon;
1 teaspoon cloves; 1 teaspoon nutmeg;
2 cups flour; 1 cup cut up prunes

Bake 1 hour at 375 degrees in 9"x 13" pan.

TOPPING

1 cup sugar; ½ cup buttermilk; 2 tablespoons
vanilla; ½ teaspoon soda; 1 stick butter

Cook 1 minute, poke holes in cake with meat fork and pour over cake while hot.
