CRACKER SNACKS

Anonymous

3 packages crackers (unsalted square); 1¼ cup Canola Oil; 1 package dry Ranch Dressing; 1-gallon Zip Lock Bag.

In Zip Lock Bag put your Canola Oil and dry Ranch Dressing and mix until blended. Add your crackers and shake until well coated. Store in a fresh Zip Lock Bag.

RHUBARB UPSIDE-DOWN CAKE

4 cups rhubarb; 1 to 1-1/2 cup sugar;
1 – 3 ounces strawberry Jell-O;
2 – 3 cups miniature marshmallows;
1 box white cake mix

Spread rhubarb in 13x9x2-inch pan which has been sprayed with non-stick spray. Sprinkle sugar over rhubarb, sprinkle jell-o over sugar and layer marshmallows on top of jell-o.

Prepare cake according to package directions and pour over marshmallows. Bake at 350 degrees for 50 to 60 minutes, just until center is set. The variation on amount of sugar and marshmallows is according to how sweet you want your rhubarb.

HEAVENLY ONION CASSEROLE

2 tablespoons butter or margarine
3 medium sweet Spanish onions, sliced
8 ounces fresh mushrooms, sliced
1 cup (4 ounces) Swiss cheese (shredded)
1 can (10 3/4 ounces) condensed cream of mushroom soup, undiluted
1 can (5 ounces) evaporated milk 2 teaspoons soy sauce
6 to 8 slices French bread (1/2 inch thick)
6 to 8 slices Swiss cheese (about 4 ounces)

In a large skillet, melt butter over medium high heat, sauté onions and mushrooms till tender. Place into a 2 quart casserole. Sprinkle shredded cheese on top. Combine soup, milk and soy sauce and pour over cheese. Top with bread and cheese slices. Cover and refrigerate four hours or over night. Bake loosely covered at 375 degrees for 30 minutes. Uncover and bake 15 to 20 minutes longer or until heated through. Let stand 5 minutes before serving. Yield 6 to 8 servings.
