COLUMBUS STATION

The COACB has started the process of purchasing Channel 8 in Columbus, Ohio. When purchased, this station will add the potential of a million new viewers.

The process of buying a station is lengthy, complicated, and expensive. The process takes three to four months before the FCC gives its approval. Often the parties involved will enter into a Leased Management Agreement (LMA) for the operation of the station in the interim. An LMA also requires the approval of the FCC but often takes less than a month for the approval. Please pray for the process that the Lord will grant his favor and this process will move along speedily.

ECLAIR CAKE

3 small boxes of vanilla instant pudding, graham crackers, chocolate frosting, 3 cups of milk, 1 container cool whip.

Mixture: Take your pudding and add your milk, after it is mixed together add your cool whip until it is well mixed set aside.

Take a 13 x 9 pan put a layer of graham crackers add 1/2 of pudding mixture, layer with more graham crackers, put the last of the pudding mixture. Top with graham crackers and frost. Refrigerate over night. Leave crackers whole.

MACARONI SALAD-HAWAIIAN STYLE

1 lb. Orzo Macaroni; 2 tablespoons flour; 2-15 oz. cans chunk pineapple (drained and juice saved); 2-15 oz. cans mandrain oranges (drained and juice saved); 1 med. bottle maraschino cherries (drained and cut in half); 3/4 cup sugar; 2 eggs, well beaten; 1/2 teaspoon salt; 1-8 oz. cool whip

Cook macaroni and rinse with cold water, let drain in colander and set aside. Cook sugar, flour, eggs, salt and juice, bring to a boil and boil for 1 to 2 minutes. Cool and pour over macaroni. Refrigerate over night. Add fruit and cool whip in the morning.

GOLDEN GATE CAKE

3/4 cup butter, softened; 1 1/2 cups sugar; 2 cups cake flour; 2 1/2 teaspoons baking powder; 3/4 teaspoon salt; 1 cup egg yolks (12); 3/4 cup milk; 3/4 teaspoon lemon extract; 3/4 teaspoon orange extract

Cream butter and sugar. Sift together flour, baking powder and Salt. Add egg yolks to creamed mixture, beating well. Add Flour mixture and milk alternately. Add flavoring. Bake in a 12x9" pan at 350 degree for 35 minutes. Use as a base for a baked Alaska or with chocolate fudge icing.

CHOCOLATE FUDGE ICING

2 cups sugar; 1/2 cup cocoa; 1/2 cup milk; 6 tablespoons margarine; 2 tablespoons light corn syrup; 1 teaspoon vanilla. Mix sugar, cocoa, milk, margarine and corn syrup. Slowly bring to a full boil, and let boil for 1 minute. Add vanilla. Cool and beat with mixer until mixture is of spreading consistency. Spread quickly. Sufficient to ice a two layer 9 inch cake or a 9x13 inch sheet cake.

After removing safety covers and inspecting the interior of the high voltage power supply, David began to laugh. He then used a pair of pliers to grab a dead mouse by the tail and remove it from the high voltage section. The entire repair took less than 10 minutes. It is still a mystery how the mouse was able to squeeze through the very small openings in the high voltage section but at least now Jonathan knows what caused the strange smelling smoke.

FAMILY CONNECTION

We are very excited to announce a new service available to the families of military personnel. We will work with soldiers immediate family to schedule appointments for video conferencing and video Emails with service men and women stationed anywhere in the world. For Video Emails, the family sets before the camera and their message is recorded and sent as an Email attachment.

For video conferencing it requires that the soldier have access to a computer, high speed internet, and camera. (Yes, these are available even on the battle field). The time for the conference is set and the necessary temporary connection information is emailed to the soldier or his commanding officer. Families are taken to a private room at the Marion station, the connection is established and then the staff leaves the room so the families and their loved one can talk and see each other in real time and privately. Video conferences last up to half an hour and are provided free or charge. Local Representative of world.viewbit.com, Pam Cudd has provided the temporary guest pass that is emailed to the soldier or his commanding officer so that full video conferencing can take place at no charge to the soldier.

The COACB originally bought the service to allow Gospel singing groups to send demos of their performance to churches and promoters by Email.
