The antenna and transmitter for Delaware have been changed so the Delaware station is now operating on channel 45. We are in the process of tweaking the transmitter. Digital is much more demanding and much harder to set up. This transmitter has 30 places where you enter corrections. The transmitter manufacturer calls these taps. To get the best output you must enter pre-distortion values in certain taps. They gave us a chart with the starting point. Every time you make a change you must also go back and check its results on the MER signal to noise ratio. It is very time consuming and we are progressing slowly.

We are anxiously awaiting the mask filter for the channel 8 transmitter to arrive from Italy. Last Friday we were informed that it was on its way from Italy to Chicago by air transport. The word was it will be here before the end of the month. A tower crew has been contacted and will install the antennas just as soon as the transmitter is ready. I know we are behind schedule on this project but some times it is beyond our control. Please pray for the project and the workers. Also I am constantly shocked at the number of items that we used to buy that were made in the US and now we must get these parts from other countries.

POSTMAN CANDY

1 cup sugar; ½ cup canned milk; ½ stick butter or margarine; 10 large marshmallows; 16 graham crackers (crushed); 1 cup chopped nuts; 1 cup coconut.

Boil sugar, milk and butter for 3 minutes. Add marshmallows; stir until melted. Add nuts, coconut and graham crackers. Stir well. Then drop by spoonfuls onto waxed paper.

POTATO CANDY

Boil a small potato until done. Chop up fine, then add confectioner sugar until like bread dough (make sure you can't taste the potato). Roll out, spread peanut butter, then roll and cut. Refrigerate.

BROWNIE BOTTOM PIE

4 squares of Bakers Semi Sweet Baking Chocolate; ¼ cup (1/2 stick) butter; ¾ cup sugar; 2 eggs; 1 teaspoon vanilla; ½ cup flour; ½ cup chopped nuts; 2½ cups cold milk; 2 packages (4 serving size) Jello instant pudding and pie filling; thawed cool whip topping.

Heat oven to 350 degrees. Grease bottom and sides of a 9 inch pie pan. Microwave chocolate and butter in a large microwavable bowl on high 2 minutes. Stir till chocolate is melted. Stir in sugar, eggs and vanilla. Mix in flour, then nuts, spread in pan. Bake 25 to 30 minutes. Cool. Pour milk into a large bowl and add pudding mixes. Beat with a wire whisk 1 minute. Let stand 2 minutes. Spread over brownie pie. Top with whipped topping. Garnish with grated Bakers chocolate. Refrigerate till ready to use.
