

CRANBERRY QUEEN CAKE

Thelma Aiken

2 cups butter, room temperature; 2 cups sugar;
2 tablespoon lemon juice; 8 eggs;
4 cups sifted cake flour; ½ cup orange relish;
½ cup nuts; ½ teaspoon baking powder.

Beat sugar and butter, add lemon. Beat eggs in one at a time beating until smooth after each addition. Add flour, relish, nuts, and baking powder. Stir until well blended. Pour batter into a well greased and floured 10 inch tube pan. Bake in 300 degree oven about 1 hour and 30 minutes or until cake tests done. Cool in pan 10 minutes, take out, cool and ice.

FROSTING

¾ cup jellied cranberry sauce; ¼ cup butter;
1 pound confectioners sugar.

Mix well and swirl frosting on sides and top of cake. Sprinkle top of cake with silver dredges.

3-BEAN OR GREEN BEAN SALAD

Drain thoroughly: 1 can French cut green beans;
1 can wax beans; 1 can kidney beans;
Mix: ½ cup cider vinegar; ½ cup oil; ¾ cup sugar;
1 small chopped onion; ½ cup (I use 1 whole) chopped green pepper ; 1 teaspoon salt; 1 teaspoon pepper. Mix all together and refrigerate.

BLUEBERRY GRANOLA BARS

½ cup honey; ¼ cup firmly packed brown sugar;
3 tablespoons vegetable oil; 1½ teaspoons ground cinnamon; 1½ cups quick-cooking oats; 2 cups fresh blueberries.

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Lightly grease a 9x9 square baking pan. In a medium saucepan, combine honey, brown sugar, oil, and cinnamon. Bring to a boil and cook for 2 minutes; do not stir. In a large mixing bowl, combine oats and blueberries.

Stir in honey mixture until thoroughly blended. Spread into prepared pan, gently pressing mixture flat. Bake until lightly browned, about 40 minutes. Cool completely in the pan on a wire rack. Cut into 1½x3 inch bars. **Makes 18 bars.**

ATTENTION KENTON VIEWERS (VERY HIGH GAIN) WINEGARD UHF ANTENNAS \$10.00 EACH

Winegard built these antennas with the intention of using them on the high UHF channels (channel 50 and up). Now the FCC has decided to eliminate all channels above channel 52 so Winegard decided that there would be no market for these antennas. Through the help of Greg Sens at Servex Electronic Distributing, the COACB was able to obtain Winegard's remaining stock of these antennas at a ridiculously low price. The COACB will provide those antennas to viewers wishing to receive TV48 in Kenton. These work great on channel 48 but not as well on the lower UHF channels. At press time there were 20 only
