APPLE SAUCE CAKE

2/3 cup butter, softened; 1½ cups sugar; 2 eggs; 2 cups flour; 1 teaspoon baking soda; 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon; 1 teaspoon ground nutmeg; 2 cups chopped dates; 2 cups chopped pecans; 1 cup raisins; 9 ounce package condensed mince meat

Cream butter and sugar, add eggs, beating them into mixture. Add applesauce. Sift together flour, soda, cinnamon and nutmeg.

Add to applesauce mixture. Mix dates, pecans, raisins and mince meat. Fold into batter. Mix well. Pour into a 9" greased and floured tube pan. Bake in a preheated 350 degree oven for 60 to 75 minutes. **Serves 15.**

FRUIT CAKE

1 can (14 oz.) sweetened condensed milk; 1 cup chopped walnuts; 3 cups or ½ pound shredded coconut; 2 cups chopped uncooked prunes or dates; ¼ pound cherries.

Blend the ingredients well. Pack in a buttered, waxed loaf pan. Bake at 375 degrees until light brown, about 30 minutes. Remove from pan; cool before cutting.

NOTE: This recipe can be doubled, and the longer you keep it before cutting, the better it tastes.

Makes 6-8 servings.

HARD TAC CANDY

2 cups water; 2/3 cup light corn syrup; ¾ cup water; 1 dram cinnamon flavoring; food coloring; powdered sugar (optional)

Mix first three ingredients in a large saucepan. Stir over medium heat until sugar dissolves. Boil, without stirring, until temperature reaches 310 degrees or until drops of syrup form hard, brittle threads in cold water.

Remove from heat.

After boiling has ceased, stir in flavoring and coloring.

Pour into lightly greased cookie sheet. Cool and break into pieces. Dust with powdered sugar, if desired. Store in air tight containers.

Makes 2 pounds.

WHERE ARE DONATIONS GOING??

News reports state that less than 25% of the \$1.5 billion donated to the September 11th fund have actually gone to help those involved in the tragedies in New York and Washington DC.
