DEMISE OF THE VCR

You have probably noticed that the price of a new VCR has dropped drastically. Three years ago a quality SVHS recorder cost at least \$1,000. Now similar units cost less than \$200.00. VCR prices start at \$42.00. The reason for the big price drop is that we are fast approaching the end of VCRs. Already some video stores handle only DVDs.

The COACB has seen this coming for three years and is migrating video storage to DVD and computer hard drives. Soon we will record programs directly to hard drives in a video server that will serve all COACB stations. We currently have the technology but are minus the needed fast computer network between our stations.

The price of a blank DVD has dropped to \$1.00 per disk which is the same as the cost of one video tape. Each stores the same amount of material but when stacked, 100 DVDs occupy the same physical space as 4 VHS tapes.

TRY THESE RECIPES AT HOME!

DR. SHAFFER'S COCOA MOKA CAKE

2 cups sifted flour; 1 tsp. soda; ½ tsp. salt; 1½ cups sugar; 4 tbsp. powdered cocoa; 1 tbsp. instant coffee; ¾ cup butter, softened; 2 eggs; 1 tsp. baking powder; 1 cup milk.

Mix and bake in 2 – 8-inch square pans, greased and floured for 40 minutes or till done in 350 degree oven. Cool and ice with:

CARMEL ICING

2 cups brown sugar; 1 cup heavy cream; 3 tbsp. butter; ½ tsp. vanilla; a pinch of salt.

Cook sugar and cream ½ hour over low heat till mixture forms a soft ball in cold water. Remove from heat and stir in butter, vanilla and salt. Stir until mixture reaches spreading consistency

MACARONI SALAD-HAWAIIAN STYLE

1 lb. Orzo Macaroni; 2 tbsp. flour; 2-15 oz. cans chunk pineapple (drained and juice saved); 2-15 oz. cans mandrain oranges (drained and juice saved); 1 med. bottle maraschino cherries (drained and cut in half); ¾ cup sugar; 2 eggs, well beaten; ½ tsp. salt; 1-8 oz. cool whip

Cook macaroni and rinse with cold water, let drain in colander and set aside. Cook sugar, flour, eggs, salt and juice, bring to a boil and boil for 1 to 2 minutes. Cool and pour over macaroni. Refrigerate over night. Add fruit and cool whip in the morning.

COCONUT PINEAPPLE PIE

1 cup sugar; 3 tbsp. all-purpose flour; 1 cup light corn syrup; 1 cup flaked coconut; 1 can (8 ounces) crushed pineapple, undrained; 3 eggs, beaten; 1 tsp. vanilla extract; 1 unbaked pastry shell (9 inches); ¼ cup butter or margarine, melted.

In a bowl, combine sugar and flour. Add the corn syrup, coconut, pineapple, eggs and vanilla; mix well.

Pour into pastry shell. Drizzle with butter. Bake at 350 degrees for 50-55 minutes or until a knife inserted near the center comes out clean. (Cover loosely with foil if the top browns too quickly.) Cool on a wire rack. Chill before cutting. Store in the refrigerator. Yield: 6-8 servings.


