ATOMIC CLOCKS

We are living in a very different world than it was a century ago. Back then, the only place where it was essential to be on time was at the railroad station, so everyone set their timepiece to the time shown on the station clock. Clocks in many homes were off by thirty minutes or more, but that caused no problems. Often Friday morning appointments just referred to some time before noon on Friday.

Now the COACB must track time down to the second. With programs coming from many different locations, circuits must be switched with split second accuracy. It is almost impossible to keep clocks at all COACB stations set to the same time. Just minor temperature changes causes clocks to gain or lose time, and electric clocks must be reset after every power outage.

While out Christmas shopping I came across some clocks that use radio signals broadcast by the National Bureau of Standards to automatically set themselves several times each day. They use a radio transmitter synchronized to an atomic clock. The atomic clock has an accuracy of +/- .0000000001 second.

The COACB has purchased three of the radio controlled clocks for its stations. **Just ask us if we know what time it is.**



WHITE CHOCOLATE CAKE

1 cup butter (softened); 2 cups sugar; 4 eggs, separated; 1 teaspoon vanilla; 1/4 pound white chocolate or almond bark, melted; 2½ cups cake flour; 1 teaspoon baking powder; 1 cup buttermilk; 1 cup chopped pecans; 1 cup flaked coconut.

Cream butter and sugar, beat in egg yolks. Add vanilla and melted chocolate. Sift together flour and baking powder and add to chocolate mixture alternately with buttermilk. Fold in stiffly beaten egg whites.

Stir in pecans and coconut. Bake in two greased and floured 9" cake pans at 350 degrees for 45 minutes. Cool and remove from pans. Ice with white chocolate icing.

WHITE CHOCOLATE ICING

1/2 cup plus 2 tablespoons sugar; 6 tablespoons evaporated milk; 1/4 cup butter or margarine; 2 cups white chocolate, broken in small pieces; 1½ teaspoons vanilla; slivered almonds toasted

Combine ingredients except almonds in top of double boiler and stir over hot water until blended. Blend until smooth. Ice cake immediately. Garnish with almonds. **Serves 15.**

COCONUT CREAM PIE

For 9" pie, mix in saucepan: 2/3 cup sugar; 3 tablespoons cornstarch; 1/2 teaspoon salt; Stir in gradually 3 cups milk.

Cook over medium heat, stirring constantly, until mixture thickens and boils. Boil 1 minute. Remove from heat. Gradually stir at least half of hot mixture into 3 egg yolks, slightly beaten. Then blend into hot mixture in saucepan. Boil 1 minute more, stirring constantly. Remove from heat. Blend in 1 tablespoon butter; 1 ½ teaspoon vanilla; 3/4 cup moist shredded coconut.

If pie is to be finished with meringue, pour immediately into baked pie shell. Spread meringue lightly on pie filling, sealing to edge of crust to prevent shrinking. Sprinkle meringue topping with 1/4 cup shredded coconut. Bake at 400 degree oven until delicately browned.

Let cool at room temperature.

NOODLE GETTI

Cook 1 pkg. (12 oz.) noodles for 8 minutes. Drain.

Brown: 1 pound ground beef; 1 medium onion; Add to beef mixture, 2 cans of tomato soup;

Add to noodles, 2 cans of cream of mushroom soup; 1 package (8 oz.) mild cheddar cheese.

Grease casserole dish and layer meat, then noodles and cheese. Repeat ending with cheese on top. Bake at 350 degrees for 30 minutes.
