**W**ALK INTO STUDIO A AND YOU WILL SEE THE TWO LARGE 50" PLASMA SCREENS, ONE ON EACH SIDE OF THE STAGE. THE SCREENS WERE INSTALLED BY GENE LUMBERSON, JONATHAN AIKEN AND DAVID AIKEN.

THESE REPLACE THE LARGE SCREEN PROJECTION TV IN STUDIO A THAT QUIT JUST BEFORE CHRISTMAS. TWELVE YEARS AGO WE PAID \$1500 FOR THAT TV AND IT HAS SERVED US WELL BUT PARTS ARE NO LONGER AVAILABLE FOR THAT TV SO DAVID AND CAROLYN SET OUT TO FIND A REPLACEMENT. CAROLYN SAID IT JUST WOULDN'T LOOK RIGHT TO HAVE JUST ONE WALL MOUNTED TV.

SINCE THE PRICE OF PLASMA TV'S HAVE DROPPED DRASTICALLY, DAVID AND CAROLYN RETURNED WITH TWO TELEVISIONS FOR WHICH THEY PAID \$599.00 EACH. THE TWO WALL BRACKETS CAME FROM CALIFORNIA AND WERE DELIVERED TO THE LOCAL WALMART STORE. WE HAD \$56.00 IN THE TWO WALL BRACKETS INCLUDING SHIPPING SO THE TOTAL PROJECT COST WAS \$ 1254.00.

## HIGH TECH LIGHTING

**O**ur readers know that the COACB has been taking steps to lower the electric bill. Over the summer we had electric bills over \$1,100 per month. We have been able to trim about \$200 by using motion sensor light switches in areas of low occupancy. We also use high efficiency fluorescent light fixtures using electronic ballasts and 32 watt t-8 bulb through out the building. Our high efficient fixtures consume about 70 watts per fixture.

I was searching the internet and came across a new product. It is a LED light panel made in China that is about 8" X 8" and consumes just 16 watts. Each unit puts out about half the light of a standard 2 bulb florescent fixture and each fixture last about 50,000 hours. The fixtures costs \$20 each including shipment from China. It just seemed too good to be true so I ordered two to evaluate them. They exceeded my expectations. I now plan to order a few at a time and start replacing our current fixtures with the LED panels. Replacing florescent fixtures with two LED panels will save 38 watts per fixture.

Try These Recipes

### PEA SALAD

1 oz package frozen green peas (thawed); ½ cup cheddar cheese, cubed; ½ cup celery, chopped; ½ cup sour cream

Combine above ingredients. Salt and pepper to taste. Refrigerate for several hours. Serve on bed of lettuce.

### BROCCOLI CASSEROLE

20 ounce broccoli cuts or spears; ½ can cream of mushroom soup (undiluted); 4 ounce can sliced mushrooms, drained; ½ jar of a small jar of regular cheese whiz (8 oz.); Butter bread cubes.

Cook broccoli per package directions. Do not over cook. Drain. Mix in other ingredients and pour into a two quart casserole. Top with bread crumbs. Bake 320 degrees for about 20 minutes until hot and bubbly, uncovered. NOTE: If broccoli is cooked in a microwave no need to add water.

### PAN BUCKEYES

2 sticks margarine; 1 cup creamy peanut butter; 1 pound confectioners sugar; 18-ounce milk chocolate bar; ½ cup peanut butter.

First melt one-cup peanut butter and margarine together and stir. Next Pour confectioners sugar. Mix well. Pat mixture into 9x13 in ungreased pan. Melt chocolate and ½ cup peanut butter together and stir. Finally, pour over top and spread. Let stand 15 minutes. Cut and serve.

### LADY BALTIMORE CAKE

½ cup butter; 1½ cups sugar; 3 cups sifted cake flour; 2½ teaspoons; baking powder; ¼ teaspoon almond extract; ½ teaspoon vanilla flavoring; 1 cup water; 4 egg whites; ½ teaspoon salt.

Cream butter and sugar. Sift together dry Ingredients. Add alternately with water to The creamed mixture. Add flavorings. Beat 3 minutes. Then add beaten egg whites and bake In 3 layers in 350 degree oven till test done. Set In pans 5 to 10 minutes. Take out, cool, fill and ice.

#### FILLING

Grind ½ pound figs; ½ pound raisins; ½ pound pecans or walnuts, set aside.

#### BOILED ICING

2 cups sugar; ½ cup water; 2 egg whites.

Boil sugar and water, without stirring until it Threads from a spoon. Stir in stiffly beaten Egg whites. Beat until stiff enough to spread. Take out 1/3 cup, and into the rest, stir in the Ground mixture. Spread between layers and on Top. Over the sides spread the 1/3 white icing.

### CHOCOLATE PEANUT BUTTER COOKIES

1 package (18 ¼ ounces) devils food cake mix; 2 eggs; 1/3 cup vegetable oil; 1 package (10 ounces) peanut butter chips

In a mixing bowl, beat cake mix, eggs, and oil (batter will be very stiff). Stir in chips. Roll into 1 in. balls. Place on lightly greased baking sheets; flatten slightly. Bake at 350 degrees for 11 minutes or until a slight indentation remains when lightly touched. Cool for 2 minutes before removing to a wire rack. Yield: 4 dozen.
