

OLD TIME PORK CAKE

1 pound salt pork (all fat); 1 pint boiling water; 4 cups sugar; ½ cup molasses; 1 egg; 1 teaspoon soda; 1 teaspoon nutmeg; 1 teaspoon cinnamon; 1 teaspoon cloves; 1 pound raisins; 6 cups flour.

Put pork through grinder. Pour boiling water over it and let stand till luke warm. Stir in sugar, spices, soda, well beaten eggs and molasses. Sift flour and add to pork mixture. Mix well. Bake 2 hours in well greased pan in 300 degree oven. Especially good for picnics or outdoor meals.

MEXICAN PASTA SALAD

¾ cup mayonnaise; ¾ cup mild or medium salsa; 1 teaspoon garlic salt; 1/8 teaspoon pepper; ½ cup dried onion; 8 ounces cooked pasta, any kind, rinsed with cold water and drained; cubes of cheddar cheese (optional).

In a large bowl combine the mayonnaise, garlic salt and pepper. Add the pasta, salsa and onion. Toss to coat. May add cubes of cheddar cheese for additional flavor. Cover and chill for one hour.
