FRUIT COCKTAIL CAKE

Mix together by hand: 2 cups flour, sifted; 1 ½ cup sugar; 2 teaspoons soda; ½ teaspoon salt; 2 eggs; 1 large can of fruit cocktail (DO NOT DRAIN).

Pour into a greased and floured 13' x 9" pan and sprinkle top with: ½ cup brown sugar and 1/2 cup chopped nuts before baking at 350 degrees for 25 minutes. Cool and serve. Top with cool whip if desired.

BANANA SPLIT CAKE

3 sticks margarine; 2 cups graham crackers; 2 cups powdered sugar; 2 eggs; 1 medium jar maraschino cherries; 5 or 6 bananas; 1 medium can crushed pineapple; 1 medium container cool whip; 1 package chopped nuts.

Mix 1 stick margarine and cracker crumbs together. Pat in bottom of large 9x13 inch pan. Mix powdered sugar, eggs and 2 sticks of margarine. Beat 10 to 15 minutes till creamy and thick. Place on top of crumbs, slice bananas length wise and lay on top of mixture. Spread drained pineapple over bananas and spread cool whip over top and sprinkle with chopped nuts and cherries.

COWBOY BEANS

1 pound ground beef; 1/2 to 1 pound bacon; 1 medium onion (diced); 1/4 cup brown sugar; 2 cans pork n beans; 1 can kidney beans (drained); 1 can butter beans (drained); 1 cup catsup; 3 tablespoon vinegar; 1 tablespoon salt

Brown ground beef and drain. Add to crock pot. Fry bacon crisp and break into pieces. Add to pot. Mix all ingredients in pot. Cook at low heat for four hours.

MISHMASH FLIPFLOP

1 ¼ cup flour; 1 cup sugar; cut in 1 stick oleo, press in pie plates; bake in 350 oven for 15 to 20 minutes

Prepare streusel. 1 cup sugar; 1 cup flour; 1 stick oleo. Cut oleo into sugar and flour and chill for 15 minutes. Pour pie filling into the baked shells and top with the streusel. Back into the oven at 350 for 35 to 40 minutes until topping is light brown.

The name: Because the shell is from one recipe, the topping from another and the filling, apple is my own canning. Flipflop is anything that I try for the first time. If it's alright it's a flip, if it's a disaster it's a flop.

Build Your Own Antenna

Do you need an antenna but are short of money? You might want to build your own.

The Hooverman phased array antenna was available for many years for just \$10.00 but its cost has now gone to over \$40.00 and since the patent expired forty years ago many people are now building their own equivalent of this excellent performing antenna.

Most people build the antenna without a reflector so it will receive stations both to the front and back. If you are farther away from the station you wish to receive, simply add a reflector 4" from the back of the antenna to make the antenna perform much better.

The antenna is very simple to build and consists of 8 V shaped elements 7" long connected to a very simple phase matching network. The antenna can be built from materials that are in most peoples garages. Since the basic Hooverman antenna is a 300 ohm antenna and all new televisions us a 75 ohm antenna a \$1.25 matching transformer is also required.

The antenna can even be built on the back of a picture and hung on the wall above the television. The picture would have to be at least 16" wide by 21" high.
