There was 21 inches of water in the transmitter building and unfortunately the transmitter was mounted 19 inches from the floor. We are still trying to determine the extent of the damages and if it is even repairable. We have a backup transmitter that is now configured to work in Kenton and should be in operation about the time this newsletter goes to press. Flood damage is not covered by insurance but no one would have ever expected to see that much water in such a short time. Also the FCC plans to repack the TV band later this year and we will be changing channels which may require a new transmitter so for now we will move slowly

Columbus is off the air also. We feed the Columbus station via fiber and our fiber circuit is down. We are expecting parts to be delivered and the fiber circuit back in operation Monday morning about the time the newsletter goes to press We are working hard repairing and getting these stations up and running again. We seek the Lord's help and guidance as we try to get both back on the air.

Gospel Sing

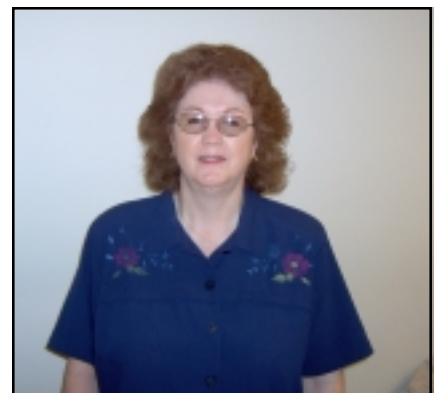

Put pork through grinder. Pour boiling water over it and let stand till luke warm. Stir in sugar, spices, soda, well beaten eggs and molasses. Sift flour and add to pork mixture. Mix well. Bake 2 hours in well greased pan in 300 degree oven. Especially good for picnics or outdoor meals.

MEXICAN PASTA SALAD

Ready or Not

Changes are coming. The FCC has posted the notice that all channels above channel 29 are going to be sold to the wireless internet industry. TV Stations using those channels will be repacked into the much smaller TV Broadcast Band. The process will be carried out over a couple of years but there will be many challenges faced to trying to accomplish this. The FCC has said that they intend to help stations with the costs involved.

Some stations will move from UHF (Channels 14 - 51) To High VHF (Channels 7 - 13) Some will even move to Low VHF (Channels 2 - 6)

For Digital TV the UHF channels work best followed by High VHF. Low VHF is the least desirable. Also to receive Low VHF requires a much larger antenna compared to a UHF antenna.
