TAGTEAMPREACHING

GOSPEL SINGING



GRANDMA SHORT COOKIES

1 cup butter, 2 cups sugar, 3 eggs, 3 1/2 to 4 cups flour, 2 teaspoons soda, 2 teaspoons baking powder, 2 teaspoons vanilla, 1 cup buttermilk

Cream butter, sugar, eggs and vanilla. Add dry ingredients and buttermilk. Mix all ingredients and store in refrigerator in a covered bowl for 24 hours. Drop by tablespoon onto greased cookie sheet. Bake at 375 degrees for 8 to 10 minutes. Use any frosting you prefer. I make my own by using powder sugar, egg white, vanilla and milk and mix to a spreading consistency. These cookies can be frozen.

PINTO BEAN PIE

1 can (15 oz.) pinto beans (mashed with juice), 2 cups sugar, 1 teaspoon vanilla, 1 stick margarine (soft), 1 cup coconut, 1 cup crushed English walnuts. Mix all together. Pour into unbaked pie shells. Three small or two large. Bake 350 degrees, 45 to 60 minutes. Good with cool whip.

SALMON APPETIZERS

One 15 ounce can salmon or 2 cups cooked salmon (flaked) One 8 ounce package of creamed cheese, softened, 4 tablespoons mild or medium salsa, 2 tablespoons chopped fresh parsley, 1 teaspoon dried Cilantro, 1/4 teaspoon ground Cumin (optional), 8 flour Tortillas (8 inch)

Drain salmon. Remove any bones. In a small bowl combine salmon, creamed cheese, salsa, parsley, and Cilantro. Add Cumin, if desired. Spread about 2 tablespoons of the salmon mixture over each tortilla. Roll each tortilla up tightly and wrap individually with plastic wrap. Refrigerate for 2 or 3 hours. Slice each tortilla into bite sized pieces. Yield 48 appetizers.

MOM'S PIZZA MAC

1 (7 ounce) box cooked macaroni, 1/2 cup milk, 1 teaspoon salt, 1 egg, 1 pound hamburger, browned and drained, 2 cups pizza sauce, 1 can mushrooms, 1 package pepperoni, 1 small onion, diced, 1 green pepper, diced, 2 cups mozzarella cheese, 1 cup shredded cheddar cheese.

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Beat milk, salt and egg together. Put macaroni on a greased cookie sheet. Spoon over sauce. Top with hamburger, mushrooms, pepperoni, onion, green pepper and cheeses. Bake 30 minutes.
