

TRY THESE RECIPES

Orange Date Cake

2 cups sugar; 1 cup butter; 4 eggs; 1 1/3 cup chopped dates (pitted); 1 cup chopped pecans; 1 recipe orange sauce; 1 1/2 cups buttermilk
4 cups all purpose flour (sifted)
1 teaspoon soda; 1/4 teaspoon salt
2 tablespoons grated orange peel

In a large mixing bowl cream butter and sugar till light and fluffy. Add eggs one at a time mixing well after each addition. Combine dates, pecans and 1/4 cup flour. Mix remaining flour, soda and salt and add to creamed mixture alternating with buttermilk, beating well after each addition till smooth. Stir in date mixture. Pour into a 10 inch tube pan greased and floured. Sprinkle with orange peel over top. Bake in 350 degree oven, one hour and twenty to thirty minutes till cake tests done. Remove from oven. Prick hot cake with fork, spoon orange sauce over top and cool in pan.

Orange Sauce

Heat together until sugar is dissolved. 1 cup sugar
2 tablespoons orange peel grated 3/4 orange juice

GRILLED CHICKEN CAESAR SALAD

8 cups torn romaine lettuce; 1 lb. boneless skinless chicken breast, grilled, cut into strips; 1 cup seasoned croutons; 1/2 cup Kraft shredded or 100% Grated Parmesan Cheese; 3/4 cup Kraft Caesar Italian Fat Free Dressing.

Toss lettuce, chicken, croutons and cheese in large salad bowl. Add dressing; toss to coat. Serve with fresh lemon wedges and fresh ground pepper, if desired.

2 boxes graham crackers, rolled into crumbs;
1 small package chopped dates; 1 cup walnuts;
1/2 bag miniature marshmallows

Mix all the above together. Add 2-3/4 cups milk. (Just enough to keep all the cracker crumbs moist!) Press into a tube pan that has been sprayed with a nonstick spray. Refrigerate. When ready to serve go around the outside edges and turn out on a plate. Garnish with pecan halves and maraschino cherries. Slice and serve with whipped topping.




HOW TO RECEIVE YOUR COACB STATION BY ANTENNA




First you need a good UHF antenna. If you are close to the station, an inside antenna may be sufficient, but usually an outside antenna mounted as high as possible works best.

HELPFUL TIP:


The COACB has made special arrangements with several suppliers to offer antennas at wholesale prices.



If your television has separate VHF and UHF inputs then you will need a splitter. Most modern TVs have only one input and do not require a splitter.



Connect your set as shown if you are using inside antennas to receive both UHF and VHF. Be sure that the UHF antenna is connected to the UHF input. If you have only one input then a combiner must be used to combine the signals from the two antennas.



If your cable company does not carry your COACB station, you can still use the UHF input and an antenna to receive it. If your set has only one input, you will need an A/B switch to switch between cable and antenna.



There are reports from several people that after installing a good outside antenna and booster, that they were able to receive up to 10 stations that their cable system did not carry.
