People didn't throw out electronic items, they had them repaired. Things have really changed. Repair parts are no longer available for most electronic items.

Four years ago, my wife Carolyn purchased a very nice printer to give to me as a Christmas present. I really liked the printer so when it quit working, I decided to have it repaired. I called the tech support number and was connected with someone in India. They took me through all the trouble shooting steps then told me that no repair is available but that they do have an exchange program. They would exchange it for a new printer for \$125.00. The original printer had cost over \$300.00. I went to Office Depot and the printer was on clearance for \$99.00.

Sadly, the same thing is now happening throughout the electronics industry. Last week a tube blew in the Delaware transmitter. I called all the normal sources without any success. One place did say they could possibly have one within a month. We were getting desperate and started internet searches. Finally, Jonathan was able to find one. It was still being made in China and one was in California. It cost \$3,220.00 to purchase the tube and have it flown to Ohio. The part was delivered on Saturday and Gary Cope installed it in the transmitter three hours later. Television broadcasting is not an inexpensive business, so if you have a few extra dollars, the COACB could sure use them.

4 cups diced cooked chicken; 1-15 oz. can pineapple chunks, drained; 1 cup chopped celery; 1-11 oz. can mandarin oranges, drained; ½ cup sliced ripe olives; ½ cup chopped green pepper; 2 tablespoons finely chopped onion.

Blend together 1 cup mayonnaise and 1 tablespoon prepared mustard. Mix all ingredients together and chill 2 to 3 hours. Add 1 package (15 oz.) chow mien noodles or serve over them. Noodles will be soggy if added too soon.
