### SWEDISH APPLE CAKE

Thelma Aiken

Sift together:  
3 cups flour; 2 teaspoons baking powder;  
1 teaspoon salt; ½ cup sugar; cut in 1 cup shortening.

Mix and add 1 beaten egg and ½ cup cold water. Mix and put dough in the refrigerator and chill. Peel and slice 8 or 9 apples very thin, mix with 1 cup sugar, ½ teaspoon cinnamon, dash of nutmeg and 2 tablespoons tapioca.

On a well floured board roll out 2/3 of the dough and fit into a greased 15x10x1 inch jelly roll pan. Roll out the 1/3 dough remaining for the top. Spread filling over dough in a pan. Dot with 1 stick of cold butter. Cover with top crust and bake in 350 degree oven for 1 hour. While still warm drizzle with thin powdered sugar glaze. Cool and cut in squares.

### ORANGE BREAD

Anonymous

¾ cup sugar; ½ cup chopped pecans;  
1 tablespoon grated orange rind;  
2 (11-ounce) cans refrigerated buttermilk biscuits;  
1 (3-ounce) package cream cheese, cut into 20 squares; ½ cup butter or margarine, melted; 1 cup sifted powdered sugar; 2 tablespoons orange juice.

Combine the first 3 ingredients in a small bowl; set aside. Separate biscuit dough into individual biscuits; gently separate individual biscuits in half. Place a cream cheese square between the 2 halves, and pinch sides to seal each back together. Dip in butter, and dredge in reserved sugar mixture.

Stand biscuits on edge in a lightly greased 12-cup Bundt pan, spacing evenly. Drizzle with remaining butter, and sprinkle with remaining sugar mixture.

Bake at 350 degrees for 45 minutes or until golden brown. Immediately invert onto a serving plate. Combine powdered sugar and orange juice; stir well. Drizzle over warm bread.

### Meat Loaf

Mix together. 1 pound hamburger; ½ cup catsup;  
1½ cups bread crumbs; 2 eggs; ½ teaspoon mustard.

Top with:  
Mix together ½ cup catsup; ¾ cup brown sugar;  
1 teaspoon mustard and put on top of meat loaf.
