LEMON SHAKE-UPS

PEACH CUSTARD

One (1) unbaked pie crust; 2 cups sliced ripe peaches; 3 beaten eggs; 1 cup sugar; 2 tablespoons butter; Cinnamon

Put peaches in pie crust. Beat eggs and sugar and pour over peaches. Sprinkle with cinnamon and dot with butter. Bake 10 minutes in 400 degree oven. Reduce heat to 350 degrees and bake 35 minutes.

1 can pineapple chunks; 1 can pears or peaches; 1 can fruit cocktail; 2 bananas, sliced; 1 package instant lemon pudding.

Drain pineapple chunks and pears or peaches. Add fruit cocktail, not drained, to pineapple and pears/peaches. Sprinkle instant lemon pudding over fruit. Mix and chill. Add bananas just before serving.

4 cups diced cooked chicken; 1-15 oz. can pineapple chunks, drained; 1 cup chopped celery; 1-11 oz. can mandarin oranges, drained; ½ cup sliced ripe olives; ½ cup chopped green pepper; 2 tablespoons finely chopped onion.

Blend together 1 cup mayonnaise and 1 tablespoon prepared mustard. Mix all ingredients together and chill 2 to 3 hours. Add 1 package (15 oz.) chow mien noodles or serve over them. Noodles will be soggy if added too soon.
