CHANGES COMING

The FCC has issued construction permits for both the Delaware and Marion stations. Delaware is being reassigned to channel 42. It must vacate channel 56 because the FCC is eliminating all television channels above channel 52.

Marion is being reassigned to channel 25. This is necessary because of new digital stations going on the air next year. There would be too much interference if the Marion station stayed on 39.

Viewers are asking how these changes will affect them. For most viewers they will just receive their COACB station on a different channel. Actually, the lower channels, are affected less by the leaves on the trees and both stations are going to a lower channel, so that in itself will help many viewers. Columbus should get a better picture from the Delaware station, and the Marion station will put more signal into Cardington, Mt. Gilead, Waldo, and Green Camp.

Both stations will operate on their new channels as class A stations, which means they are recognized as primary service stations. Both stations are currently operating as a secondary

SWEDISH APPLE CAKE

Thelma Aiken

8 apples; 1/2 tsp cinnamon; Dash of Nutmeg; 2 tbs dry Tapioca; 1/2 cup sugar; 1 tsp salt; 3 cups flour; 2 tsp. baking powder; 1 egg; 1 cup shortening; 1 stick of butter; Powered sugar and milk for glaze.

Sift together 3 cups flour; 2 tsp. baking powder; 1 tsp salt 1/2 cup sugar; Cut in 1 cup of shortening, Mix and add one beaten egg and 1/2 cup of cold water. Mix then put dough in the refrigerator to chill.

Peel and slice very thin, eight apples. Mix with 1 cup sugar; 1/2 tsp cinnamon; dash of nutmeg; 2 tbs dry tapioca.

On a well floured board, roll out 2/3 of the dough and fit into a greased 15" x 10" x 1" jelly roll pan. Roll out the remaining dough for the top. Spread the filling over the dough in the pan. Dot with 1 stick of butter. Cover with top crust and bake at 350 deg. for one hour. While still warm, drizzle with a thin powdered sugar glaze consisting of 3 tbs of powered sugar and 2 tbs of milk. If too thick, thin with more milk so that it will run. Cool and cut into squares.

PUMPKIN COOKIES

2 cups flour; 1 cup sugar; 1 cup quick oats; 1 egg; 1 teaspoon baking soda; 1 teaspoon cinnamon; 1/2 tsp salt; 1 cup butter, softened; 1 cup brown sugar; 1 cup canned pumpkin; 1 teaspoon vanilla; Decorations: sprinkles, raisins, chocolate chips, nuts, frosting, etc.

Mix together flour, oats, baking soda, cinnamon and salt. Cream butter, sugar, and brown sugar. Add the egg, vanilla, and pumpkin to the butter sugar mixture. Mix in dry ingredients. Drop 1/4 cup of dough onto cookie sheet and form each into a pumpkin shape. Bake 20-25 minutes at 350 degrees. Decorate cooled cookies.

FRUIT COCKTAIL CAKE

Mix together by hand:

2 cups flour, sifted; 1 1/2 cup sugar; 2 teaspoons soda; 1/2 teaspoon salt; 2 eggs; 1 large can of fruit cocktail (DO NOT DRAIN).

Pour into a greased and floured 13" x 9" pan and sprinkle top with: 1/2 cup brown sugar and 1/2 cup chopped nuts before baking at 350 degrees for 25 minutes. Cool and serve. Top with cool whip if
