Try These Recipes

## RED VELVET CAKE

THELMA AIKEN

Sift together in one bowl:

2 cups all purpose flour; 1 teaspoon baking powder; 1 teaspoon salt; 1 teaspoon cocoa

In another bowl cream:

3/4 cup oil; 1 1/2 cups sugar; Add: 2 eggs (one at a time); Add: 1 oz bottle red food coloring; after eggs. Mix well: 1 cup buttermilk; and 1 teaspoon baking soda. Add 1 teaspoon vinegar; 1 teaspoon vanilla extract

Mix all together and spoon into two greased 9-inch cake pans. Bake in 350 degree pre-heated oven for 25 to 30 minutes until done.

Combine 3/4 cup milk and 1/2 cup sugar in a sauce pan and bring to boil, spoon evenly over each cake layer, cool and frost.

**FROSTING:**

1 - 8 oz. pkg. cream cheese 1/2 cup margarine; 1 teaspoon vanilla extract; 1 lb. confectioner sugar; 1 cup coconut; 4 to 5 drops red food coloring

Combine cream cheese, margarine and vanilla extract in a mixing bowl. Beat till smooth, gradually adding sugar while beating. Add 3/4 cup coconut. Mix well. Spread between layers and on top and sides of cake. Combine remaining 1/4 cup of coconut and food coloring and sprinkle over cake.

## APPLE CIDER COOKIES

1 cup firmly packed light brown sugar; 1/2 cup margarine; 1/2 cup apple cider; 1/2 cup refrigerated real egg product, like Egg Beaters; 2 1/4 cups all-purpose flour; 1 1/2 teaspoons ground cinnamon; 1 teaspoon baking soda; 1/4 teaspoon salt; 2 medium apples, peeled and diced (about 1 1/2 cups); 3/4 cup almonds, chopped. Cider Glaze

In large bowl, with electric mixer at medium speed, beat sugar and margarine until creamy. Add cider and real egg product; beat until smooth. With electric mixer at low speed, gradually blend in flour, cinnamon, baking soda and salt. Stir in apples and almonds. Drop dough by tablespoons, 2 inches apart, onto greased baking sheets. Bake at 375 degrees for 10-12 minutes or until golden brown. Remove from cookie sheets and cool on wire racks. Drizzle with Cider Glaze. Makes 4 dozen cookies.

Cider Glaze: In small bowl, combine 1 cup powdered sugar and 2 tablespoons apple cider until smooth.

## PUMPKIN PIE

Make pastry for one-crust pie. Line pie pan.

**FILLING:** For 9" Pie: Beat together with rotary beater: 1 3/4 cups mashed cooked pumpkin (may be canned); 1/2 teaspoon salt; 1 3/4 cups milk; 3 eggs or 4 yolks; 2/3 cup brown sugar (packed); 2 tablespoons granulated sugar; 1 1/4 teaspoon cinnamon; 1/2 teaspoon ginger; 1/2 teaspoon nutmeg; 1/4 teaspoon cloves.

Pour into pastry-lined pie pan. Temperature: 425 degree for 45 to 55 minutes. Bake

just until a silver knife inserted 1" from side of filling comes out clean. The center may still look soft but will set later. Serve slightly warm or cold.



## CREAMED BAKED CHICKEN

ART DODGE

1 whole chicken; 1 pint sour cream; 1 can cream of mushroom or chicken soup; 1/2 pound melted butter; 2 cups cracker crumbs; 3 tablespoons poppy seed; 1 cup chicken broth.

Cook chicken. Remove from bone and place in buttered dish. Whip together sour cream and cream of mushroom or chicken soup and spread over chicken. Mix together melted butter, cracker crumbs and poppy seed. Put on top of chicken. Then pour chicken broth reserved from chicken on top. Bake at 350 degrees for 1 hour. Great over mashed potatoes or rice.

## PEA SALAD

BETTY SYCK

1 oz package frozen green peas (thawed); 1/2 cup cheddar cheese, cubed; 1/2 cup celery, chopped; 1/2 cup sour cream

Combine above ingredients. Salt and pepper to taste. Refrigerate for several hours. Serve on bed of lettuce.
