



PUMPKIN CAKE ROLL

THELMA AIKEN

3 eggs; 1 cup sugar; 2/3 cup pumpkin; 1 teaspoon lemon juice; 3/4 cup flour; 1 teaspoon baking powder; 6 ounces cream cheese (softened); 1/4 cup margarine (softened); 1/2 teaspoon salt; 2 teaspoons cinnamon; 1 teaspoon ginger; 1/2 teaspoon nutmeg; 1 cup finely chopped pecans; 1 confectioner sugar; 1/2 teaspoon vanilla; 1 cup confectioner sugar

Beat eggs in mixer at high speed for 5 minutes. Add sugar gradually, mixing well. Stir in pumpkin and lemon juice. Combine flour, baking powder, salt, cinnamon, ginger and nutmeg in a bowl and mix well. Fold in egg mixture and stir in pecans. Pour into a greased and floured 10 x 15 inch pan. Bake at 375 degrees for 15 minutes. Invert into towel, sprinkled with 1 cup confectioner sugar. Roll towel as for jelly roll. Combine cream cheese, margarine and remaining cup of confectioner sugar and vanilla, mixing till smooth. Unroll cake and spread with cream cheese mixture. Roll as for jelly roll to enclose filling. Makes 10 servings.

HARD TAC CANDY

2 cups sugar; 2/3 cup light corn syrup; 3/4 cup water; 1 dram cinnamon flavoring; food coloring; powdered sugar (optional)

Mix first three ingredients in a large saucepan. Stir over medium heat until sugar dissolves. Boil, without stirring, until temperature reaches 310 degrees or until drops of syrup form hard, brittle threads in cold water. Remove from heat. After boiling has ceased, stir in flavoring and coloring. Pour into lightly greased cookie sheet. Cool and break into pieces. Dust with powdered sugar, if desired. Store in air tight containers. Makes 2 pounds.

GINGER CRISPS

Cream together: 1 1/2 cup butter or margarine; 1 1/2 cup sugar; 1/2 molasses; 2 eggs, beaten

Add sifted together dry ingredients: 4 1/2 cup flour; 5 teaspoons baking powder; 1/2 teaspoon soda; 2 teaspoons cinnamon; 1 teaspoon ginger; 1/2 teaspoon salt; 1/4 teaspoon ground cloves

Mix thoroughly and chill about 2 hours. Form into 1 1/4" balls. Roll in sugar. Bake 2: apart on reased cookie sheets at 375 degrees. 10-12 minutes. Makes about 5 dozens cookies.

SUGAR AND SOUR HAM

1 an (20 oz.) pineapple chunks; 3 tablespoons brown sugar; 2 tablespoons cornstarch; 1/2 teaspoon ground ginger; 1/2 cup water; 3 tablespoons white vinegar; 2 cups cubed fully cooked ham; 1 small green pepper, cut into julienne strips; 1/4 cup thinly sliced halved onion; 1 tablespoon canola oil; Hot cooked rice

Drain pineapple, reserving juice and pineapple chunks. In a bowl, combine the brown sugar, cornstarch and ginger. Stir in the water, vinegar and reserved juice until smooth; set aside. In a large non stick skillet, sauté the ham, green pepper and onion in hot oil over medium high heat for 3 minutes or until ham is lightly browned and vegetables are crisp tender. Stir reserved pineapple chunks in to skillet; heat through. Stir juice mixture. Gradually stir into skillet. Bring to a boil; cook and stir for 1-2 minutes or until thickened. Serve over rice.

PUMPKIN COOKIES

ANONYMOUS

2 cups flour; 1 cup sugar; 1 cup quick oats; 1 egg; 1 teaspoon baking soda; 1 teaspoon cinnamon; 1/2 teaspoon salt; 1 cup butter, softened; 1 cup brown sugar; 1 cup canned pumpkin; 1 teaspoon vanilla; Decorations: sprinkles, raisins, chocolate chips, nuts, frosting, etc.

Mix together flour, oats, baking soda, cinnamon and salt. Cream butter, sugar and brown sugar. Add the egg, vanilla and pumpkin to the butter sugar mixture. Mix in dry ingredients. Drop 1/4 cup of dough onto cookie sheet and form each into a pumpkin shape. Bake 20-25 minutes at 350 degrees. Decorate cooled cookies.

GOING UNTO ALL THE WORLD

While at calling hours for Mary Dennison, a long time supporter of TV 39, I was talking to Joe Earhart, her brother-in-law, and he asked how things were going at the station. I told him that I was having problems with a project that required high speed streaming video over the internet. I had tried all the current technology and nothing was suitable. Joe said that his son-in-law, Mike Croghan, could solve that problem with a system he had developed. I spoke to Mike and he said that my problem would be easy to solve and he and his wife would meet with me at the station after the funeral.

Mike gave me a demonstration of a new codex that he had developed and it was far advanced of anything I had ever seen. Using his special codex, he streamed video at 300 KB and it looked as good as streams that required six times that bandwidth. He further said that in memory of his wife's aunt, Mary Dennison, he would donate the use of the codex to the station.

The COACB now uses Mike's special codex to stream a live 250 KB stream and we have received reports of people watching from India, Germany, Canada, as well as all across the US. The COACB airs a live program called Quiz Bowl: Battle of the Brains, featuring local schools competing in an intellectual contest. Wednesday before the program started our lobby was filled with mothers on their cell phone calling relatives across the country telling them that they could see the program live on the internet.

Mike Croghan's company is called Training Direct, www.trdirect.com. Mike provides streaming service for the city of Akron as well as other customers. Go to his website to see demos and the many services that he can provide. His codex is proprietary and major companies including Microsoft are still trying to figure out how he did it.

Retailers are getting very worried about the analogue TVs that they have currently have in stock. Before Christmas look for new 25" TVs to sell for as low as \$59.00. The Federal Government also requires retailers to inform buyers that broadcasters are to shut down their analogue transmitters in just 15 months. In just three months the Federal Government will start issuing to each US household two vouchers each worth \$45 toward the purchase of a converter box.

The change to digital was first scheduled to happen in 2006 but was delayed because the cost of going digital was prohibitively high. Broadcasters sought and obtained extensions, but now the FCC says digital will happen this time and there will be no extensions. Just four years ago it was estimated that it would cost at least \$10,000,000 for each station to go digital. That costs has now dropped drastically. I have estimates of \$86,000 to set up a digital station that carries six programs at the same time.

Digital broadcaster can be very creative with their stations. Think of their transmitters as giant one way modems. This modem has over 18 Meg of bandwidth. This is enough bandwidth for six programs at analog quality or two high definition programs. It can also be used for one high definition and three at analogue quality. The broadcaster can also lease out bandwidth for other services. Some may choose to use 2.1 MEG of bandwidth for their own use and lease out 16 MEG to another company.

There is currently a push by broadcasters seeking permission from the FCC for them to use MPEG4 which would allow each station to carry up 12 programs at the same time on one digital station. I really expect this will be approved in the near future. It is also possible that the FCC may only require that the broadcasters air one stream that can be viewed by digital TVs and will then permit the rest of their bandwidth to be used for any purpose that the broadcaster chooses. We are amazed at the quality of the 300 KB streams that we have seen using Mike Croghan's streaming codex. One digital transmitter could carry one 2.1 Meg (open stream) and thirty of the 300 KB streams at the same time. That is 31 programs on one transmitter
