WXCB WAITING ON CANADA



The US has a treaty with Canada that requires all stations within 150 miles of the border be coordinated between the FCC and its counterpart in the Canadian government. WXCB in Delaware is 100 miles from the border, so changes to the station's coverage area must be approved by both government agencies.

On August 19, the FCC placed the WXCB application on the proposed grant list and forwarded the paperwork on to Canada for their approval. Since there is such a small amount of Canadian soil within 150 miles of WXCB, no problems are expected. Approval should be granted as soon as their commission meets.

WXCB plans to place an order for all the equipment needed for the channel change and power increase on the day final approval is given.

WXCB will increase its power 300% and change its operating channel to 42.



THREE DAY COCONUT CAKE

1 Box Duncan Hines yellow butter cake mix
Mix and bake as directed and cool. Slice in layers crosswise to make 4 layers.

Icing & Filling

2 cups sugar
8 oz. sour cream
8 oz. coconut (Reserve 1/2 cup for later)
8 oz. container of cool whip
Mix together well and spread between layers and over top of cake. Sprinkle 1/2 cup coconut over top of cake.

Let set in the refrigerator 3 days and serve.

1 can evaporated milk; 1 cup walnuts;
1 large Hershey bar; 1 pint marshmallow cream;
1 package chocolate chips; 1½ cups sugar.

Cook sugar with milk. Boil 7 minutes, stirring constantly. Add Hershey bar, marshmallow cream and chocolate chips. Mix well and stir until melted. Add walnuts. Pour into buttered pan. Cool and cut into squares.

PEACH COBBLER

2 cups fresh peaches; 1/3 to 1/2 cup sugar;
2 tablespoons flour; 2 tablespoons lemon juice;
1 tablespoon butter.

Put peaches in a greased baking dish. Sprinkle with mixture of sugar, flour, butter and lemon juice. Drop dough by spoonfuls over peaches. Bake at 425 degrees for 30 minutes.

SOMETHING GOOD RELISH

6 pounds green tomatoes (ground);
6 red and green peppers (ground); 1 quart cider vinegar; 2½ pounds brown sugar;
½ ounce whole cloves.

Mix all ingredients and simmer one hour. Pack in sterilized jars and seal.

MARION WAL-MART

GIVES GRANT TO TV-39

Friday Sept. 20, 2002 in a special presentation in the Wal-Mart restaurant area, attended by almost all store employees, checks were presented to five local non-profit organization.
