RECEIVEING DIGITAL STATIONS

The COACB has been digital for over a year and still many people do not know how to receive digital signals over the air. The COACB has four television stations: Channel 48 in Kenton, Channel 8 in Columbus, Channel 45 in Delaware, and Channel 39 in Marion. Since we simulcast the four stations, and in order to keep confusion to a minimum, we decided to map all four stations to virtual channel 39.

When your TV set scans for digital channels it makes up a look up table listing of all the local virtual channels and where each is by actual channel. Once you have scanned for digital channels, your receiver will remap all COACB stations to channel 39. You will select channel 39 and the receiver will select your local COACB channel. If you are watching 8 in Columbus your receiver knows that virtual channel 39 is broadcast on actual channel 8. In Kenton channel 39 is actually channel 48. In Delaware channel 39 is actually 45. In all cases your COACB stations is identified as channel 39.

All digital stations use virtual channels. Channel 4 in Columbus is actually on channel 14, Channel 10 is on 21, 28 is on 36, and 6 is on 13. In every case the receiver scans for digital channels and then tunes the stations from their virtual channel list. Just remember your COACB station is always virtual channel 39.

TRY THESE RECIPES!

3-BEAN OR GREEN BEAN SALAD

Drain thoroughly: 1 can French cut green beans; 1 can wax beans; 1 can kidney beans; Mix: ½ cup cider vinegar; ½ cup oil; ¾ cup sugar; 1 small chopped onion; ½ cup (I use 1 whole) chopped green pepper; 1 teaspoon salt; 1 teaspoon pepper. Mix all together and refrigerate. (Will keep forever.)

PEACH CUSTARD

One (1) unbaked pie crust; 2 cups sliced ripe peaches; 3 beaten eggs; 1 cup sugar; 2 tablespoons butter; Cinnamon

Put peaches in pie crust. Beat eggs and sugar and pour over peaches. Sprinkle with cinnamon and dot with butter. Bake 10 minutes in 400 degree oven. Reduce heat to 350 degrees and bake 35 minutes.

ICE CREAM PUNCH

½ gal. pineapple sherbet; 1 pkg. frozen raspberries or strawberries; 1 banana

Put together in big bowl and mash with fork. Mash it good. Add enough 7-up to make it slushy. Serve in cups with spoons because it is too thick to drink.

REFRIGERATOR CUCUMBER SLICES

4 pounds cucumbers (about 6 large), cut into ¼ inch slices; 3 medium onions, cut into 1/8- inch slices; 3 cups sugar; 3 cups cider vinegar; 4 teaspoons canning/pickling salt; 1-1/2 teaspoons mustard seed; ½ teaspoon alum

In a large container, combine cucumbers and onions. In a large bowl, combine the remaining ingredients, stirring until sugar is dissolved. Pour over cucumber mixture; mix well. Cover and chill overnight. May be refrigerated for up to two (2) weeks. Yield: About 2-1/2 quarts.

ROADHOUSE POTATOES

3 cups half and half cream; 1/2 cup butter; 1 teaspoon salt; 2 pounds frozen hash browns (thawed); 1/2 cup grated parmesan cheese

Heat cream and butter. Add salt. Place potatoes in flat greased glass 9 x 12 inch dish. Pour cream mixture over potatoes. Sprinkle cheese on top. Bake at 325 degrees for 1 hour.
