On August 12, 2005 application was made to the FCC for New Life Fellowship of Churches to sell Channel 8 in Columbus, Ohio to the Central Ohio Association of Christian Broadcasters Inc. (COACB) the station has been off the air since October 2004. Equipment need to put the station back on the air has been ordered and the station should be back on the air within days. The transmitter for channel 8 is located on a platform at 700 feet on the WBNS tower in Columbus. A microwave system is used to deliver audio, video, and control to the transmitter. The platform is reachable by elevator but the COACB technical crew sure hopes they don't have to take that long ride up the tower too often. The COACB looks forward to serving the city of Columbus and has received many calls from churches asking when the station will be on the air.

### FAMILY CONNECTION

The COACB in cooperation with the Red Cross, Veteran Services, and [www.viewbit.com](http://www.viewbit.com) are providing free video Emails and Video conferencing to military personnel and their families. Michael Grant owner of View Bit spent years writing and perfecting the computer code needed to make this process work... He finally launched the service over the Memorial Day



weekend. The COACB first looked at the process as a way churches could provide video of their activities to members in remote locations and Gospel singing groups could provide demos via Email. After realizing all the capabilities of the process, David Aiken asked Pam Cudd, representative of View Bit, if the COACB could offer video conferencing to military families in the area. Her answer was yes and that View Bit would provide the temporary service at the remote location for free. The Family Connection Service was started at the Marion Facility and will be extended to all COACB facilities. Organizations in other states are now contacting View bit to offer similar service for military families in their states.

## HEAVENLY ONION CASSEROLE

THELMA AIKEN

2 tablespoons butter or margarine; 3 medium sweet Spanish onions, sliced; 8 ounces fresh mushrooms, sliced; 1 cup (4 ounces) Swiss cheese (shredded); 1 can (10 3/4 ounces) condensed cream of mushroom soup, undiluted; 1 can (5 ounces) evaporated milk 2 teaspoons soy sauce; 6 to 8 slices French bread (1/2 inch thick); 6 to 8 slices Swiss cheese (about 4 ounces)

In a large skillet, melt butter over medium high heat, sauté onions and mushrooms till tender. Place into a 12 inch x 7 1/2 inch x 2 inch or 2 quart casserole. Sprinkle shredded cheese on top. Combine soup, milk and soy sauce and pour over cheese. Top with bread and cheese slices. Cover and refrigerate four hours or over night. Bake loosely covered at 375 degrees for 30 minutes. Uncover and bake 15 to 20 minutes longer or until heated through. Let stand 5 minutes before serving. Yield 6 to 8 servings.

## REESE CANDY

1 cup peanut butter; 1 box confectioners sugar (2 cups); 2 sticks butter (softened); 1 package crushed graham crackers; 1 - 12 ounce semisweet chocolate chips

Mix crushed crackers, butter, sugar and peanut butter until creamy. Spread onto greased cookie sheet (any size). Heat chocolate chips on stove until smooth and spread over peanut butter mixture. Cool and enjoy.

## SUMMER CHICKEN SALAD

4 cups diced cooked chicken; 1-15 oz. can pineapple chunks, drained; 1 cup chopped celery; 1-11 oz. can mandarin oranges, drained; 1/2 cup sliced ripe olives; 1/2 cup chopped green pepper; 2 tablespoons finely chopped onion.

Blend together 1 cup mayonnaise and 1 tablespoon prepared mustard. Mix all ingredients together and chill 2 to 3 hours. Add 1 package (15 oz.) chow mien noodles or serve over them. Noodles will be soggy if added too soon.

## BUTTERSCOTCH FRUIT DIP

1 (14 oz.) can Eagle Brand Milk; 1 cup butterscotch bits; ¼ teaspoon salt; 2 teaspoons white vinegar; scant ¼ - ½ teaspoon cinnamon.

In heavy saucepan over low heat, add milk, bits, and salt. Cook, stirring until the bits are melted. Remove from heat and add cinnamon, stir until mixed through add vinegar and mix well. Serve with apple and pear slices.

## SEVEN LAYER COOKIES

1 stick margarine; 1 - 1/2 cups of graham cracker crumbs; 1 cup of chocolate chips; 1 cup butterscotch chips; 1 cup coconut; 1/2 to 1 cup of pecan or walnut pieces; 1 can Eagle Brand sweetened condensed milk.

Melt margarine and mix graham cracker crumbs into it. Press mixture evenly in 13"x9"x2" baking dish. Spread evenly as follows: chocolate chips, butterscotch ships and coconut. Drizzle 3/4 can of Eagle Brand sweetened condensed milk over ingredients, then sprinkle pecans or walnuts. Distribute remaining Eagle Brand over mixture. Bake at 350 degrees for 30 minutes. Allow to cool and cut into squares. Yields 20 cookies.

## PIZZA CASSEROLE

Cook 2 cups twisted macaroni. Meanwhile brown 1 pound ground beef, ½ cup chopped onion and ½ teaspoon salt. Mix altogether with 10½ oz. pizza sauce, 12 oz. tomato paste, ½ teaspoon salt, and ½ teaspoon garlic salt. Place one-half mixture in large casserole and top with grated mozzarella cheese and pepperoni slices.

Add remaining mixture and top with more mozzarella cheese and pepperoni slices. Sprinkle with grated parmesan cheese and bake 350 degrees for 45 minutes.
