ACCEPTED FOR FILING

Those are three simple words that mean so much to the COACB. They mean that the FCC has accepted our paper work and has started processing it. Now we just play the waiting game while service coordination is made with the Canadian equivalent of the FCC.

We are not anticipating any problems and we expect that all three digital construction permits will be granted within 90 days of the filing date, which was September 4, 2008.

The FCC had announced that they would start accepting applications on August 4 and that they would process them in the order received so all day on August 3, I anxiously waited for midnight, planning to be one of the first to file the forms electronically.

Finally midnight arrived and I thought that I would wait one more minute just in case the clock was off on the computer. At 12:01 I made contact with the FCC server and started downloading the applications. At 12:03 I received a confirmation that my application was assigned a file number. Although my application was in the system at 12:03 AM, twenty other applications had arrived before mine.

Three days later I checked the FCC website and saw the messages that all three COACB applications had been accepted for filing.

EQUIPMENT FOR PRISONS

Ohio Jails and Prisons are being required to install their own private CATV systems. Budget cuts have not allowed any money to buy programming from either Cable or Satellite. The COACB has publicly stated, that it will provide the equipment needed, at no cost, to add its stations to the lineup of any CATV system. However we provide equipment just for the COACB channels in the lineup.

TRY THESE RECIPES!

3-BEAN OR GREEN BEAN SALAD

Drain thoroughly: 1 can French cut green beans; 1 can wax beans; 1 can kidney beans; Mix: ½ cup cider vinegar; ½ cup oil; ¾ cup sugar; 1 small chopped onion; ½ cup (I use 1 whole) chopped green pepper; 1 teaspoon salt; 1 teaspoon pepper. Mix all together and refrigerate. (Will keep forever.)

PEACH CUSTARD

One (1) unbaked pie crust; 2 cups sliced ripe peaches; 3 beaten eggs; 1 cup sugar; 2 tablespoons butter; Cinnamon

Put peaches in pie crust. Beat eggs and sugar and pour over peaches. Sprinkle with cinnamon and dot with butter. Bake 10 minutes in 400 degree oven. Reduce heat to 350 degrees and bake 35 minutes.

ICE CREAM PUNCH

½ gal. pineapple sherbet; 1 pkg. frozen raspberries or strawberries; 1 banana

Put together in big bowl and mash with fork. Mash it good. Add enough 7-up to make it slushy. Serve in cups with spoons because it is too thick to drink.

REFRIGERATOR CUCUMBER SLICES

4 pounds cucumbers (about 6 large), cut into ¼ inch slices; 3 medium onions, cut into 1/8- inch slices; 3 cups sugar; 3 cups cider vinegar; 4 teaspoons canning/pickling salt; 1-1/2 teaspoons mustard seed; ½ teaspoon alum

In a large container, combine cucumbers and onions. In a large bowl, combine the remaining ingredients, stirring until sugar is dissolved. Pour over cucumber mixture; mix well. Cover and chill overnight. May be refrigerated for up to two (2) weeks. Yield: About 2-1/2 quarts.

ROADHOUSE POTATOES

3 cups half and half cream; 1/2 cup butter; 1 teaspoon salt; 2 pounds frozen hash browns (thawed); 1/2 cup grated parmesan cheese

Heat cream and butter. Add salt. Place potatoes in flat greased glass 9 x 12 inch dish. Pour cream mixture over potatoes. Sprinkle cheese on top. Bake at 325 degrees for 1 hour.
