WXCB TO TRIPLE POWER

Delaware's TV station WXCB is currently awaiting FCC approval to increase its power by almost 300%. Approval is expected within the next 30 - 60 days. An additional 30 days is required for the delivery of new equipment.

This is a very significant increase and will allow the Delaware station to not only serve all the areas it now serves but also a large portion of Columbus. Over 500,000 people will be within the grade "B" contour, and over a million people will be within range of the station.

Delaware's channel will also be changed from 56 to 42. Plans call for the station to shut down for three days in either October or November to allow crews to install a new antenna and other equipment. The station will then sign back on the air as the Class A station WXCB channel 42.

WXCB is currently working very hard to raise the \$18,000 needed for the power increase and channel change.

CHANGES AT MARION

Marion station WOCB received some very good news from its consultant R & L Media in Hendersonville, TN. Calculations using computer software modeled on Longly-Rice studies show that TV39 can stay on channel 39, and with FCC approval it can double its power.

Longley-Rice studies take into the account the shielding effect of the terrain and many other factors that are not used in normal modeling and interference prediction. Those studies are approved for use by the FCC, but the cost to buy the software is so high that few consulting firms use them.

TV39 has applied to the FCC for permission to double its power. FCC approval is expected within the next 60 days. Equipment delivery should be about 30 days after approval is received. The total cost for the power increase is expect to be about \$15,000.

Although towers crews are expected to be on the tower for two days, the station will only be off the air for only 20 minutes while the change over is made. Once the changes are completed, the station will sign back on the air as the Class A station WOCB.

COACB VOLUNTEER





STUFFED GREEN PEPPERS

6 large green peppers; 1 pound ground beef, browned; 2 tablespoons minced onion; 1 teaspoon salt; 1/8 teaspoon garlic powder; 2 cups cooked rice; 15 ounce can tomato sauce; 3/4 cup shredded mozzarella cheese

Cut peppers in half and remove seeds. Combine all ingredients except peppers and cheese. Stuff peppers with ground beef mixture. Place in crockpot. Cover. Cook on low 6-8 hours, on high 3-4 hours. Sprinkle with cheese during the last 30 minutes.

TEXAS SHEET CAKE

1 cup water; 2 sticks oleo; 3 tablespoons cocoa; 2 cups sifted flour; 2 cups sugar; 1/2 teaspoon salt; 2 eggs; 1 cup sour cream; 1 teaspoon baking soda.

Combine water, oleo, and cocoa in saucepan and bring to a boil. Remove from heat and add flour, sugar and salt. Mix well. Beat in eggs, sour cream and baking soda. Pour into greased 9"x13" pan. Bake at 375 degrees for 20 to 22 minutes.

ICING

1 teaspoon vanilla; 1 stick oleo, melted; 6 tablespoons milk; 4 tablespoons cocoa; 1 box confectioner's sugar; 1 cup chopped walnuts.

Mix vanilla, oleo, and milk until well blended. Gradually add cocoa and sugar until smooth and creamy. Spread over cooled cake and sprinkle with nuts.
