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Too Many Honeybees



Thank you to Mr. Troy Chapman for helping out with our honeybee problem in the back shed. He came out at least three different times to collect bees and was finally able to get all the comb out. He said there was a 4'x2' piece of honeycomb in the walls. He also said there was a lot of brood (baby honeybees) in the combs. He collected about 10 lbs. of honeycomb which amounts to about 20,000 bees. He said this was a well-established hive and it may be difficult to get them to move out. He will be back a couple more times in the evening to collect the worker bees that were out in the fields. He is hoping they don't create a new queen to start a new hive. He said collecting a swarm is easier because they are not established anywhere, but since ours had been there for at least a few years they had a home.

On his first trip, Shannon and Tyler wanted to see the progress thinking about how angry bees behave. Tyler walked out back with bees buzzing around the top of his head. Shannon took one step out of the back door and was stung in the forehead. Tyler was the hero by removing the live bee from her hair and pulling out the stinger that was stuck in her forehead. Shredded Pork Tacos

3-5 lb boneless pork shoulder 1 c chicken broth
1/2 c enchilada sauce 4 - 8" soft flour tortillas
or taco shells

Assorted toppers like tomatoes, onion, cheese, lettuce, jalapenos, avocado, and sour cream

Trim fat from pork and cut to fit in slow cooker. Add broth, cover and cook on high heat for 4-5 hours.

Remove from cooker, discard broth. shred meat with forks. In med saucepan, combine meat and enchilada sauce. Cover & cook about 10 min med heat.

Assemble tacos.

Easy Baked Macaroni and Cheese

1 1/2 c elbow macaroni 3 T butter
3 T flour 2 c whole milk
1/2 t ea. salt/pepper 1 c shredded cheddar cheese
1 c. shredded mozzarella cheese

Preheat oven 350 deg. Cook macaroni per directions for al dente. Melt butter in skillet, add flour and stir over medium heat about 1-2 minutes. Add milk stir till no lumps and starts to thicken about 6 min. Stir in cheese and whisk till smooth. Place cooked pasta in lg greased casserole dish and mix in cheese mixture. Bake about 20-25 min or until browned and bubbly.

Banana Split Kebabs

2 bananas cut into 1" pieces 24 1" pieces pineapple
12 lg strawberries halved 2 c chocolate chips
1/2 c chopped peanuts.

Make Kebabs: Thread two pieces each banana, pineapple, and strawberry onto skewer. Repeat process to assemble 23 more skewers. Place all on parchment-lined baking sheet. Melt chocolate in microwave in 30-sec intervals, stirring in between, until smooth. Drizzle chocolate over fruit kebabs and top with chopped peanuts. Freeze till ready to serve.
